

SUPPLIES NEEDED


Fabric for piecing the 58" x 58" quilt top and binding.

All fabrics are from the Salutations collection by Rashida Coleman-Hale, listed below:



- Batting at least 68" x 68"
- Backing 4 yds
- Thread for piecing and quilting

CUTTING

For each of the colorful accent fabrics, cut your fabric into (3) $2\frac{1}{2}$ by the width of fabric strips. (4) for the Heliotrope. Sub cut the strips into the required sizes listed in the chart below.

For the off white background fabric, cut your fabric into (26) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by the width of fabric strips and (5) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " by width of fabric strips. Sub cut the strips into the required sizes listed in the chart below.





NINE PATCH BLOCKS

You will be creating a total of (45) 6%" nine patch blocks using strip piecing




- 1. Take (1) 2%" x 15" Lapis strip and (2) 2%" x 15" Natural strips and sew the three strips together as shown in the image, alternating the colors light/dark/light to create (1) 6%" x 15" rectangle. Repeat this step to create a total of (2) 6%" x 15" rectangles.
- 2. Take (2) 2%" x 15" Lapis strips and (1) 2%" x 15" Natural strip and sew the three strips together as shown in the image, alternating the colors dark/light/dark to create (1) 6%" x 15" rectangle.
- 3. You'll now have (3) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 15" rectangles. One dark and two light. Press the seams toward the dark fabric.
- 4. Next, subcut each of the (3) rectangles into (6) $2 \% '' \times 6 \% ''$ strips.



5. Sew three alternating strips together as shown in the image to create a total of 6 Lapis Nine Patch blocks.







STRIP SETS

You will be creating a total of (72) 2 ½" x 6 ½" strip sets using strip piecing



- 9. Press the seams toward the dark fabric.
- 10. Next, subcut each of the (2) rectangles into (7) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.



11. Use the chart below as a guide to repeat steps 8-10 for the remaining colorways to create a total of (72) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " strip sets. Set aside.

ACCENT BLOCKS










You will be using the strip sets you just made to create a total of (36) 6½" accent blocks

- 12. Take (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Soft Black strip set, (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Heliotrope strip set, and (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Natural strip and sew together as shown in the image to create (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " block.
- 13. Press the seams toward the dark fabric.




14. Use the images on the left as a guide to repeat steps 12-13 for the remaining colorways to create a total of $(36) 6\frac{1}{2}$ " accent blocks. Set aside.

ASSEMBLING THE BLOCKS

You will be using the Nine Patch Blocks and the Accent Blocks to create (9) 181/2" blocks

- 15. Arrange the blocks as shown. Double check to make sure that they are arranged correctly. Pin and sew the $6\frac{1}{2}$ " blocks into rows of three, matching up the seams. Press the seams open.
- 16. Pin and sew the rows together, matching up the seams as shown.
- 17. Repeat steps 15 and 16 to complete (9) $18\frac{1}{2}$ " blocks.




ASSEMBLING THE SASHING

You will be using the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 18" Natural strips and the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to create (2) rows of sashing

- 18. Using the image as a guide, arrange (3) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $18\frac{1}{2}$ " Natural strips, (1) Vintage Blue $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square, and (1) Aqua $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square as shown. Double check to make sure that they are arranged correctly. Pin and sew the strips and squares in a row to create (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $58\frac{1}{2}$ " strip. Press the seams open.
- 19. Arrange (3) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $18\frac{1}{2}$ " Natural strips, (1) Soft Black $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square, and (1) Golden Hour $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat step 8 using the image as a guide.



ASSEMBLING THE QUILT TOP





20. Using the image as a guide, arrange the blocks and sashing as shown.
Place Block 1, 2, and 3 with (1) 2½" x 18½" sashing strip in between. Sew together to complete (1) row. Press the seams open.



- 21. Repeat Step 20 with the remaining blocks to create a total of (3) rows.
- 22. Sew the rows and sashing as shown to complete the quilt top. Press the seams open.
